Scope:

Research career development resources & opportunities available through SCRI, UW and ITHS

Local, Most Relevant, Non-exhaustive

B = bench, basic research \(\bar{\} \)
P = clinical and population health \(\bar{\} \)



SCRI-Wide Mentored Career Development Awards

SCRI Career Development Award (CDA) (Tracks: 1 1/4)

- Up to 3 years, Open to all
- Minimum 75% FTE effort, \$100,000 salary support, \$25,000 supplies/year
- Funder: SCRI
- Next RFA: April application due; October start

SCRI Excellence in Research Award (Tracks: 1 1)

- Up to 3 years, Focused on underrepresented scientists
- Minimum 75% FTE effort, \$100,000 salary support, \$25,000 supplies/year
- Funder: SCRI
- No application. Discuss with Center Director regarding feasibility

SCRI Center for Diversity and Health Equity (CDHE) Mentored Scholars Grant (Tracks 1 h)

- 2 years
- \$100,000/year
- Early career faculty and postdoctoral fellows transitioning to faculty positions who meet NIH definition for under-represented populations
- Next RFA: Opens December 2023 for FY25 cycle









SCRI Center-Specific Mentored Career Development Awards

- Open to CCTR, BTCCCR, or CRBT members
- 2 years
- Standard path (clinician-scholar, clinician-clinician)
 - Minimum 30% FTE (10% CCTR, 20% protected time from division/dept/SCH) and salary plus fringe and \$10,000/yr for research/career development
- Intensive path (generally physician-scientist track)
 - Minimum 50% FTE (25% CCTR, 25% match from division/dept/SCH) and salary plus fringe per year and \$20,000/yr for research/career development

SCRI CCHBD: Center for Child Health Behavior and Development Mentored Scholars Program ()

- 2 years
- \$25,000 in salary and fringe; matched by scholar's division or department + \$15,000 research funds (10,000 CCHBD, \$5,000 division/department)





ITHS Mentored Career Development Awards from NIH

ITHS KL2 (NIH/NCATS)(1 1.)

- Translational research across the spectrum from basic science to population health.
- UW Medicine, Social Work, Nursing, Public Health and More and WWAMI wide
- 3 years, minimum of 75% of salary (up to \$85,000/yr), + \$25,000 research funds/yr and \$2,500/yr for travel

Supplements to ITHS KL2 (1 1.)

- Topic/discipline specific KL2 supplements, 2-3 years
- Some NIH institutes or programs (e.g., NCCIH, INCLUDE) have supported additional scholar KL2 positions.
- ITHS announces and solicits expressions of interest when opportunities are available
- Rolling, similar support as ITHS KL2



NIH-funded Mentored Career Development Awards, cont.

UW Pediatric and Reproductive Environmental Health Scholars K12 Program (PREHS)(♠)

- 2-3 years
- About \$20K for project funds
- For clinically trained scientists who will gain expertise in environmental health
- Pediatric and reproductive environmental health, for clinically-trained scientists with expertise in environmental health, the sciences of environmental exposures and their health effects in the child life-course
- Minimum 75% FTE, provides salary support and associated fringe benefits
- Funder: NIH National Institute of Environmental Health Sciences

NIH Awards (Å 🖍)

Mentored K Awards include K01, K07, K08, K23, K25, and K99/R00



Other Career Development Opportunities

NIH Diversity Supplements (1 1)

- Can be attached to NIH awards, including R01 and similar awards
- SCRI has a <u>NIH Diversity Supplements Connections Program</u>
- ITHS Hub for Diversity Supplements

Re-Entry & Re-Integration Supplements (ITHS and other NIH funded centers) (1 1/4)

• <u>Supplements to existing NIH awards</u> (similar to diversity supplements) for scientists who have experiences at least 6 months of full or partial interruption in their careers for family responsibilities or other qualifying circumstances

- Designed to recruit and retain highly qualified health professionals into biomedical or biobehavioral research careers
- Up to \$50,000 annually in return for commitment to engage in NIH mission-relevant research

Kaiser CATALyST Award ()

• Health Services oriented. Not currently accepting applications.

SCRI Center for Diversity and Health Equity (CDHE) Fellows and Residents' Health Equity Grant,

• \$500-\$15,000 (**\hat{h}**)

UW and ITHS Pilot / Project Funds

UW Royalty Research Funds (non-SCRI investigators) (k)

• \$40,000, must apply through UW

ITHS Pilot Awards ()

- \$50k, 1-year, new interdisciplinary academic partnerships (Å 🖍)
- \$50k, 1-year, academic community partnerships ()

• \$3-5K awards considered quarterly for research coordination services, bioethics consultations, statistical support, etc.

- On-demand courses on a variety of early career topics, 1-8+ hours
 - Grant/manuscript writing, science communication, etc.
- Available to SCRI Investigators (institutional subscription); not via UW

Dept of Pediatrics Grant writing course for basic scientists, K or R ()

- Focused on grant writing for basic/bench scientists
- Annual, Open to UW Dept of Pediatrics Faculty

ITHS Clinical Grant Writing Course via Dept. of Pediatrics, K or R award ()

- For UW, Hutch, Seattle Children's, and WWAMI Region (\$ tuition may be required)

Coaching

- Develop a clear roadmap to achieve short and long-term goals
- Monthly 1-hour meeting, 6 months commitment
